

For each day that you are at home, pick 3 activities to do throughout the day. Some of them, like bug club, you can access on more than one day (highlighted with a **. They are all 'snow day' themed.

You should also do these every day:

- Read for 15-30 minutes (If you don't have your school book, pick anything from home or on bug club)
- Log on to Times Table Rock Stars for 15 minutes
- Practise your spellings (They are on the website if you haven't got your homework sheet)

Snow Statue	Get out into the snow and build a statue out of snow – be creative, try to think of something other than a snowman to build. Once you've finished, take a picture and email it to me.

Snow Day Write	At the end of your day, use the activity sheet to sum up your day. Follow the instructions
up *	on the sheet – remember to use a thesaurus to help you find fantastic words – I don't want to see 'it was great' or 'cold' – you're Year 5s now!
Winter Trees	Look at the presentation and follow the instructions to draw your own winter tree. Can you design your own winter forest?
Sledging *	Sledging is a great way to keep active and you don't even need a sledge – a plastic bag or bin bag are sometimes even better than a sledge. Give it a go and email me some pictures.
Paper Snowflakes	Follow the basic instructions to make a paper snowflake. After you have finished, write
	the instructions on a piece of paper, complete with an introduction, top tip and picture.
